

Standards

FAMILY DAYHOME STANDARDS MANUAL FOR ALBERTA

This manual contains the standards for Dayhomes and Dayhome agencies to provide child care. Every month we will review a Standard.

Standard 10A: Incidents

- an emergency evacuation;
- unexpected program closure;
- an intruder in the program residence;
- a serious illness or injury to a child that requires the program educator or parent to request emergency health care and/or requires the child to remain in hospital overnight;
- an error in the administration of medication by the program educator or other resident;
- the death of a child;
- an unexpected absence of a child from the program (i.e. lost child);
- a child removed from the program by a non-custodial parent or guardian;
- an allegation of physical, sexual, emotional abuse and/or neglect of a child by a program educator or another resident of the home;
- the commission by a child of an offence under an Act of Canada or Alberta; and/or
- a child left unattended in the program home outside of the program's operating hours. If an incident occurs, a program must:
- obtain emergency medical assistance as required;
- immediately notify the parent or emergency contact if parent is unavailable;
- notify the agency immediately and complete an incident report; and
- participate in inspections conducted by the agency and/or licensing staff or other law enforcement agencies as required.

Making the Best of a Bad Air Day

Unfavorable air quality prompted us to stay inside today. To accommodate this change, I devised a simple playdough invitation featuring dinosaurs, allowing for a seamless transition to imaginative play.

Playdough is a wonderful sensory and learning experience for children.

As my little children shape the playdough into a ball or a log, they're thinking creatively. The squeezing, pinching and pulling movements also strengthen these children's hand muscles and develop their fine motor skills.

I provided H with small pots to encourage his culinary interests, which he has shown a strong affinity for. He then proceeded to use these pots to create playdough dishes.

Little Miss H's singing of the ABC song during playdough playtime inspired me to provide alphabet dough cutters, which added an extra layer of enjoyment to her playtime.

W and V demonstrated their proficiency in playdough artistry by creating a habitable cave for dinosaurs and unearthing fossils within the malleable medium. Overall, it was a very productive day.





Minister's Awards of Excellence

in Child Development

Overview

Early childhood professionals make life better for children and families and support government's commitment to high quality child care choices that are responsive to and inclusive of all children.

Nominate an individual, team, or program where early childhood educators work with children in child care programs licensed by the Alberta government.

Nomination guidelines

Alberta's government will administer the Minister's Awards of Excellence in Child Development according to these guidelines, and will consider nominators and nominees who agree to or sign the nomination form to have read and agree to abide by these guidelines and requirements for participating in the awards nomination process. Nominations that do not comply with these guidelines may be disqualified.

Nomination deadline: August 30, 2024

Award categories

Individual (three awards)

An early childhood educator working with children in an eligible program licensed in Alberta.

Team (three awards)

An early childhood educator working with children in an eligible program licensed in Alberta.

Program (three awards)

An early childhood educator working with children in an eligible program licensed in Alberta.

Award criteria

Nominees must demonstrate professional excellence in at least one, or a maximum of two, of the following award criteria areas.

Highlight these criteria throughout the nomination, illustrating how the nominee demonstrates excellence in each area in ways that support children's learning and development.

Innovative programming

Translate unique, research-based knowledge into creative actions that support learning and development.

Family/parent support

Demonstrate open, collaborative relationships, family-oriented support and programming.

Continuous improvement

Participation in training, professional development of staff is a priority; active pursuit of professional growth.

Community building

Develop partnerships and advance supports within the community to complement children's learning.

Inclusive practices

Demonstrate practices that include special needs, explore learning and cultural diversity.

Leadership

Training, coaching and mentoring professionals, colleagues to ensure quality child care.
