Crayons on Wood

Materials:

-Liquid watercolors, piece of sanded scrap wood, crayons, brushes

Setting up this Play Invitation:

- 1. Collect pieces of scrap wood, choosing different sizes and shapes. Sand the surface and edges to avoid splinters.
- 2. Organize the crayons and place them on a table with the sanded wood pieces.
- 3. Prepare the watercolors with the brushes.

How to Create the Painting:

- 1. Have children draw wild and wonderful lines all over the piece of wood. Offer a variety of crayons.
- 2. When children finish their drawing, invite them to paint over the wood drawing with water-colors.

- How many different sounds?
- How are they changing?
- What's the loudest sound?

Learning Story



Water Play

July 9, 2025

I set up the water wall and sand box (just the box) filled with water added with flex balls (the kids filled into the box of water), measuring cups, scoopers, funnels and more. The kids explored the water as well as the materials provided. They kept going back scooping, pouring and filling those tubes/pipes and were very fascinated observing how the water just poured down and dripping. They were curious of how the water traveled from one end to the other end and noticed that the bottle on the bottom was filled in with water after pouring lots of water into the bottle connected from the top.







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July 10, 2025

I observed that the children were really interested in playing water and enjoying so I decided to set up the water table/water wheel play table with funnels, Pom Pom, shells, a mirror, duct cleaner, measuring cups and other toys. Also, I let them add ice cubes and sprinkles at the end of thei play to further their exploration and experimentation.



Water wall and water table play encourage social interaction, enhance problem solving abilities, learning about gravity, develop hand-eye co-ordination and motor skills and strengh. The ice cube sensory exploration allows them to explore texture, temperature and state of matter.



Berry Loaf

- 13/4 cups all purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 cup yogurt (lemon or lime flavour if available)
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp grated lemon zest
- 1 cup fresh or frozen berries (raspberries, saskatoons)



Variation: Substitute berries with sour cherries (Evans, Juliet, Cupid, Carmine Jewel), and substitute lemon zest with almond extract. Use plain or vanilla yogurt.

Preheat oven to 350 F. Spray a 9 x 5 inch loaf pan with non-stick spray and set aside.

In a large bowl, combine flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Set aside.

In a medium bowl, whisk together yogurt vegetable oil, eggs and zest. Add wet ingredients to flour mixture and stir just until moistened. Fold in the berries.

Pour batter into pan and bake for 50 minutes (or until tooth pick comes out clean). Cool loaf in the pan for 10 minutes. Remove from pan. Let cool completely before slicing.

Strawberry Cobbler

- 4 cups frozen strawberries, thawed and drained
- 1 cup juice from strawberries and water to yield
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp cornstarch
- 2 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 2 cups flour
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp salt
- 6 Tbsp shortening
- 1 cup milk

Preheat Oven to 375 F

Combine juice, sugar, cornstarch and cook until mixture thickens. Add lemon juice, cinnamon and strawberries. Pour into greased 1 1/2 quart casserole dish or baking pan. Mix remaining ingredients to make biscuit dough and drop onto fruit. Bake 35-40 minutes. Enjoy warm with ice cream or cream.
